We consider reaching people who do not know God personally to be one of our greatest responsibilities. Our Sunday services, which we call Collectives, are for ALL people at all stages in their spiritual journey, but are primarily designed for those who do not yet have a genuine relationship with God.

LOVE PEOPLE: WE LOVE PEOPLE THROUGH CONVERSATIONS

We believe life change happens in the context of relationships. Conversations have one simple purpose: to bring people together. God created us to live in community with others and it is only then that we can experience the full life He intends for us.

BUILD DISCIPLES: WE BUILD DISCIPLES THROUGH REVIVAL CULTURE

Revival CULTURE will help you discover, develop your purpose and live the full life God created for you. Revival Culture is made up of four steps, and will equip you to LOVE GOD, LOVE PEOPLE, BUILD DISCIPLES, AND REVIVE CULTURE.

REVIVE CULTURE: WE REVIVE CULTURE THROUGH COLLABS

All of us were created by God to transform culture in the world around us. God has a place for you where your unique abilities and passions can impact the lives of others.

REVIVAL MENTALITY

Revival mentality starts with our hearts, our thinking, our ways of being and the larger culture in which we all live. It is the attitude and paradigm that informs how we live. As followers of Jesus, we are called to think, and subsequently live, in ways that are fundamentally different than the world. This different “way” is what brings each of us into faith and community despite our own individual differences. This mentality defines who we are and how we reflect God in every area of our life. It guides our decisions, shapes our community and helps us build a culture that is alive, faith-filled and transformational. Revival Mentality is demonstrated in the following 8 attributes:

2. **CREATIVITY:** WE DESIGN WITH THE BEAUTY OF GOD (*Psalms 104:24*)
3. **DISCOVERY:** WE SEEK TRUTH EVERYWHERE (*Proverbs 2:3-5*)
4. **FAMILY:** WE ACCEPT EVERYONE (*Galatians 3:28*)
5. **GENEROSITY:** WE LIVE OPEN LIVES (*2 Corinthians 9:11*)
6. **HEALTHY:** WE LIVE IN RHYTHM WITH MARGIN (*Matthew 11:28*)
7. **PARTY:** WE CELEBRATE EVERYTHING (*Philippians 4:4*)
8. **QUALITY:** WE SET THE BAR FOR EXCELLENCE (*Daniel 6:3 (NIV)*)

STEP ONE | JOIN THE FAM

“So now you Gentiles are no longer strangers and foreigners. You are citizens along with all of God’s holy people. You are members of God’s family.” (**Ephesians 2:19**)

At Calvary Revival Church, we believe church is more than a place you attend—it is a family you belong to. When you join the Revival Fam, you become part of a community committed to loving God, loving people, and seeing lives transformed.

In this step, you’ll learn about the vision, mission, and culture of CRC.

WHAT WE BELIEVE*

REVIVAL GOVERNANCE

As you consider investing your heart, time, family and finances into the life of a church, it is important for you to feel confident in church leadership. Our goal in sharing the details of our governance is that you will understand that we are structured to support the values of integrity, accountability and spiritual authority.

1. STRENGTHENED BY THE _____

The Board of Presbyters are respected leaders who love Calvary Revival Church and are willing to provide spiritual protection, direction and support. Guided by the Pastoral and Diaconal Team

2. PROTECTED BY THE BOARD OF ELDERS

The Board of Elders are members of the congregation appointed by the Pastors to oversee the finances and direct the provision of the facilities needed by the church. They provide counsel to the Pastors regarding the major financial commitments of the church.

3. PASTOR AND DIACONAL

The Pastoral and Diaconal team is led by Pastors David and Lydia Osborne. This team serves the congregation and is responsible for the development of the spiritual life of the church.

4. SUPPORTED BY STAFF

The staff of Calvary Revival Church are entrusted are entrusted with the stewardship and implementation of the vision and mission.

5. CHAMPIONED BY _____

Our Co-Laborers are the volunteers that act as the hands and feet of the vision and mission.

6. CARRIED BY THE CONGREGATION

The prayers, love, and support of the congregation enables REVIVAL.

GIVING & GENEROSITY

Giving is one of the central themes in the Bible. Jesus talked more about this subject than Heaven, Hell or prayer. To understand what it means to be a Christ-follower, we must also understand what it means to be a generous giver. At CRC, we practice tithing for the support of the church. We recognize that giving 10% of our income is the Biblical standard for giving.

“Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this,” says the Lord Almighty, “and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it.” (**Malachi 3:10**)

At CRC, we want people to understand they are giving to God through the church, not to the church. As we openly share the honesty, integrity and spiritual values that guide our financial practices, we believe people can focus on what God is calling them to give and trust that He is leading our church to steward it well. Generosity is worship to Jesus and an expression of the relationship between the individual giver and the Lord. Funds are not “income only,” they are worship and are not considered to be a business transaction but an expression of gratitude toward God.

The tithe, or “first fruits” of our labor/income belong to God. We find this principle all through God’s Word. Tithing, giving God the first 10% of our income to the local church, is the primary, practical way we acknowledge that God is first. (**Proverbs 3:9–10**)

OFFERINGS

An offering is giving over and above the tithe. The Bible says that by giving generously, we are able to “take hold of the life that is truly life.” You aren’t really living unless you are freely giving. (**1 Timothy 6:18–19**)

THE GIFT OF GIVING

The gift of giving is a spiritual gift that God gives to some people (**Romans 12:8**). It is a Spirit-given capacity and desire to serve God by giving of your material resources, far beyond the tithe, to further the work of God.

REVIVAL CHARGE

A charge is a commitment that family members take to define their identity and commitment to the vision and mission of the house they are committing to. It reminds us of our purpose and role in the body of Christ.

11 “Now these are the gifts Christ gave to the church: the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, and the pastors and teachers.”

When you understand how God created you, it becomes easier to see where you can make the greatest impact. Your gifts are meant to _____ others and help build broken lives back to life.

Please take time to complete the Spiritual Gifts Assessment. This assessment will help you discover how God has uniquely gifted you to serve. On the following pages, you will learn more about spiritual gifts and explore opportunities to use those gifts to build disciples, serve others and make an impact at CRC.”

1. ADMINISTRATION

The gift of administration is the ability to organize multiple tasks and groups of people to accomplish these tasks.

(Luke 14:28-30; Acts 6:1-7; 1 Corinthians 12:28) (All Teams)

2. APOSTLESHIP

The gift of the apostleship is the ability to pioneer new churches through planting, overseeing, and training.

(Acts 15:22-35; 1 Corinthians 12:28; 2 Corinthians 12:12; Galatians 2:7-10; Ephesians 4:11-14)

(Collabs, Conversations, Next Steps)

3. CRAFTSMANSHIP

The gift of craftsmanship is the ability to plan, build and work with your hands in construction environments to accomplish multiple projects.

(Exodus 30:22, 31:3-11; 2 Chronicles 34:9-13; Acts 18:2-3) (Creative, Collabs, Logistics, Revival Worship, REVIVE, Student and Family)

4. DISCERNMENT

Between right and wrong motives and situations. (**Matthew 16:21-23; Acts 5:1-11, 16:16-18; 1 Corinthians 12:10; 1 John 4:1-6**) (All Teams)

5. EVANGELISM

The gift of evangelism is the ability to help Non-Christians take the necessary steps to becoming followers of Jesus. (**Acts 8:5-6, 8:26-40, 14:21, 21:8; Ephesians 4:11-14**) (All Teams)

6. EXHORTATION

The gift of exhortation is the ability to encourage others through the written or spoken word and Biblical truth. (**Acts 14:22; Romans 12:8; 1 Timothy 4:13; Hebrews 10:24-25**) (Conversations, Guest Services, Next Steps, Revival Worship, Student and Family)

7. FAITH

The gift of faith is the ability to believe in God for unseen supernatural results in every arena of life. (**Acts 11:22-24; Romans 4:18-21; 1 Corinthians 12:9; Hebrews 11**) (Care, Prayer, Revive)

8. GENEROSITY

The gift of giving is the ability to give by tithes and offerings and to produce wealth for the purpose of advancing the Kingdom of God on earth. (**Mark 12:41-44; Romans 12:8; 2 Corinthians 8:1-7, 9:2-7**) (Revival Legacy)

9. HEALING

The gift of healing is the ability to act as an intermediary in faith and prayer for the healing of physical and mental illnesses. (**Acts 3:1-10, 9:32-35, 28:7-10; 1 Corinthians 12:9, 28**) (Care, Heart, Prayer)

10. HELPER

The gift of helps is the ability to work in a supportive role for the accomplishment of tasks in Christian ministry. (**Mark 15:40-41; Acts 9:36; Romans 16:1-2; 1 Corinthians 12:28**) (All Teams)

11. HOSPITALITY

The gift of hospitality is the divine strength or ability to create warm, welcoming environments for others in places such as your home, office or church. (**Acts 16:14-15; Romans 12:13, 16:23; Hebrews 13:1-2; 1 Peter 4:9**) (Conversations, Guest Services, Logistics, Next Steps, Student and Family, Vibes)

12. INTERCESSION

The gift of intercession is the divine strength or ability to stand in the gap in prayer for someone, something, or someplace believing for profound results. (**Hebrews 7:25; Colossians 1:9-12, 4:12-13; James 5:14-16**) (Prayer)

13. KNOWLEDGE

The gift of knowledge is the divine strength or ability to understand and to bring clarity to situations and circumstances often accompanied by a word from God.

(Acts 5:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:8; Colossians 2:2-3) (Conversations, Guest Services-HEART, Prayer, Security)

14. LEADERSHIP

The gift of leadership is the divine strength or ability to influence people at their level while directing and focusing them on the big picture, vision, or idea. **Romans 12:8; 1 Timothy 3:1-13, 5:17; Hebrews 13:17** (All Teams)

15. MERCY

The gift of mercy is the divine strength or ability to feel empathy and to care for those who are hurting in any way. **(Matthew 9:35-36; Mark 9:41; Romans 12:8; 1 Thessalonians 5:14)** (Conversations, Collabs, Guest Services- HEART, Security)

16. MIRACLES

The gift of miracles is the divine strength or ability to alter the natural outcomes of life in a supernatural way through prayer, faith, and divine direction. **(Acts 9:36-42, 19:11-12, 20:7-12; Romans 15:18-19; 1 Corinthians 12:10, 28)** (Guest Services-HEART, Prayer)

17. MISSIONARY

The missionary gift is the divine strength or ability to reach others outside of your culture and nationality, while in most cases living in that culture or nation. **(Acts 8:4, 13:2-3, 22:21; Romans 10:15)** (Collabs, Conversations, Student and Family)

18. MUSIC/WORSHIP

The gift of music/worship is the divine strength or ability to sing, dance, or play an instrument primarily for the purpose of helping others worship God. **(Deuteronomy 31:22; 1 Samuel 16:16; 1 Chronicles 16:41-42; 2 Chronicles 5:12-13, 34:12; Psalm 150)** (Conversations, Revival Worship, Student and Family)

19. PASTOR/SHEPHERD

The gift of pastor/shepherd is the divine strength or ability to care for the personal needs of others by nurturing and mending life issues. **(John 10:1-18; Ephesians 4:11-14; 1 Timothy 3:1-7; 1 Peter 5:1-3)** (Collabs, Conversations, Revival Culture, Student and Family,)

20. PROPHECY

The gift of prophecy is the divine strength or ability to boldly speak and bring clarity to scriptural and doctrinal truth, in some cases foretelling God's plan. (**Acts 2:37-40, 7:51-53, 26:24-29; 1 Corinthians 14:1-4; Thessalonians 1:5**) (Conversations, Prayer, Revival Worship)

21. SERVICE

The gift of serving is the divine strength or ability to do small or great tasks in working for the overall good of the body of Christ. (**Acts 6:1-7; Romans 12:7; Galatians 6:10; 1 Timothy 1:16-18; Titus 3:14**) (All Teams)

22. TEACHING

The gift of teaching is the divine strength or ability to study and learn from the Scriptures primarily to bring understanding and growth to other Christians. (**Acts 18:24-28, 20:20-21; 1 Corinthians 12:28; Ephesians 4:11-14**) (Conversations, Next Steps-Love God 101 & Revival Culture, Student and Family)

23. TONGUES (AND INTERPRETATION)

The gift of tongues is the divine strength or ability to pray in a heavenly language to encourage your spirit and to commune with God. The gift of tongues is often accompanied by interpretation and should be used appropriately. (**Acts 2:1-13; 1 Corinthians 12:10, 14:1-14**) (Prayer)

24. WISDOM

The gift of wisdom is the divine strength or ability to apply the truths of Scripture in a practical way, producing a fruitful outcome and the character of Jesus Christ. (**Acts 6:3,10; 1 Corinthians 2:6-13, 12:8**) (Conversations, Prayer, Revival Worship, Student and Family)

STEP THREE | COLLAB WITH US

"The human body has many parts, but the many parts make up one whole body. So it is with the body of Christ." (1 Corinthians 12:12)

God designed the church like a body where every person has a role and every gift matters. You were created not just to attend church, but to be part of what God is doing.

In this step, you will explore how your gifts connect with the mission of CRC and discover opportunities to collab. When we bring our gifts together, we create an environment where people can encounter God and experience transformation.

WHAT IS A _____ ?

Collabs - Collaborations - are teams of incredible people who have discovered their gifts and passions and are actively using them to serve others. Whether it is creating a welcoming environment through Guest Services, investing in the next generation with Student and Family, crafting a dynamic worship experience with Creative, or breaking down barriers across our city by leading Conversations, there is a place for everyone.

HOW DO I JOIN A COLLAB _____ ?

Joining a Collab happens through Revival.

Step 3 of Revival Culture is specifically designed to help you choose and join a Collab that aligns with your passions and gifts. This step takes place on the third Sunday of every month after each service.

At Calvary Revival Church, we believe everyone has a purpose.

Joining a Collab is a powerful way to live that out—serving others and making an impact using the gifts God has given you.

1. CARE

Helps people grow and make friends in small groups and assists CRC FAM who have experienced illness or death in their immediate families. **Funeral wAssistance, Home Visits, Family and Senior Calls**

2. CREATIVE / PRODUCTION

Assists in the production of the overall worship experience, using lights, cameras, and other visual elements. **Lights, Photography, Collective Coordinators, Social Media, Stagehands, and Video**

3. GUEST SERVICES

Adds a personal touch to our worship experience by hosting and helping with excellence. **HEART, Hospitality, Hosts and Parking**

4. LOGISTICS

Ensures the building is clean and safe for worship services, meetings and events. **Facilities, Maintenance and Security**

5. NEXT STEPS

Assists those who are taking next steps in their personal and spiritual growth. **A-Team, Altar, Baptism, Connect Callers, Conversation Leaders, Information Hosts, Love God 101 Facilitator, Online Hosts and Revival Culture Facilitator**

6. PRAYER

Intercedes weekly on behalf of our church, the community and the world. **Intercessory Prayer**

7. REVIVE

Serves the community and surrounding cities with planning and facilitating outreach initiatives. **Packing Meals, Senior Deliveries, Revive Center Setup, Distribution and Clean Up**

8. REVIVAL WORSHIP

Facilitates a powerful worship experience through vocals, instruments, and audio engineering. **Band, Choir / Worship Team, Dance, Film/Theatre**

9. STUDENT AND FAMILY

Invests in the lives of students through worship, biblical teaching, creative and student-led videos, conversations, and impactful relationships. **Revival Kids (Infants – 5th grade), Rev'd Students (Middle and HighSchool), Rev'd U (College Students)**

10. VIBES

Sets the tone and environment of the church through thoughtful decor and intentional design. This team curates a welcoming and inspiring atmosphere. **Event Setup/ Breakdown, Decorating and Staging**

"Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves; ensure justice for those being crushed."

(Proverbs 31:8)

Safeguarding equips individuals with the knowledge, awareness and responsibility to help protect vulnerable populations and create safe, secure and healthy environments within our church community.

In this step, you will learn how we safeguard children, youth and vulnerable individuals while maintaining a culture of integrity, accountability and care. Safeguarding ensures that everyone who enters CRC experiences a place that is safe, trusted and honoring to God.

ABUSE POLICY

I acknowledge that Calvary Revival Church's mission is to Build Broken Lives Back to Life. Therefore, our church is committed to providing a safe environment for worship, fellowship, and service.

The church adheres to all Federal and State laws concerning the reporting of suspected neglect, physical abuse, sexual abuse, and domestic abuse. Neglect is the failure to provide for the basic needs of a child or vulnerable adult, such as adequate food, appropriate clothing and footwear, sufficient supervision, and necessary medical care.

Physical abuse is any intentional act that causes bodily injury or trauma, including slapping, choking, hitting, punching, kicking, or shoving.

Sexual abuse or assault involves any interaction or contact between a child and an older child or adult for sexual gratification. This includes photographs, videos, nudity, inappropriate touching, and intercourse.

Domestic abuse is the mistreatment of a family member or intimate partner by another person within the household.

I understand that I am not responsible for conducting investigations. I will not confront the alleged parent or caregiver, child, or abuser under any circumstances.

As a Co-Laborer, I acknowledge that any suspected neglect, physical abuse, sexual abuse, or domestic abuse involving any child or person must be reported to the Director of the relevant department. I am responsible for submitting an incident report for each occurrence.

FINANCIAL (Joshua 1:8; Malachi 3:10-11; Luke 6:38; 2 Corinthians 9:6-10; Deuteronomy 28:1-14; Psalm 34:10, 84:11; Philippians 4:19)

HEALING OF THE SICK

Healing of the sick is illustrated in the life and ministry of Jesus and included in the commission of Jesus to His disciples. It is given as a sign, which is to follow believers. It is also a part of Jesus' work on the cross and one of the gifts of the Spirit. (Psalm 103:2-3; Isaiah 53:5; Matthew 8:16-17; Mark 16:17-18; Acts 8:6-7; James 5:14-16; 1 Corinthians 12:9, 28; Romans 11:29)

HEAVEN

Heaven is the eternal dwelling place for all believers in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. (Matthew 5:3, 12, 20, 6:20, 19:21, 25:34; 2 Corinthians 5:1; Hebrews 11:16; 1 Peter 1:4)

HELL

After living one life on earth, the unbelievers will be judged by God and sent to Hell where they will be eternally tormented with the Devil and the Fallen Angels. (Matthew 25:41; Mark 9:43-48; Hebrews 9:27; Revelation 14:9-11, 20:12-15, 21:8)

HOLY BIBLE

The Holy Bible, and only the Bible, is the authoritative Word of God. It alone is the final authority in determining all doctrinal truths. In its original writing, it is inspired, infallible, and inerrant. (2 Timothy 3:16; 2 Peter 1:20-21; Proverbs 30:5; Romans 16:25-26)

JESUS CHRIST

Jesus Christ is God the Son, the second person of the Trinity. On earth, Jesus was 100% God and 100% man. He is the only man ever to have lived a sinless life. He was born of a virgin, performed miracles, died on the cross for mankind, and thus atoned for our sins through the shedding of His blood. He rose from the dead on the third day according to the Scriptures, ascended to the right hand of the Father, and will return again in power and glory. (John 1:1,14, 20:28; 1 Timothy 3:16; Isaiah 9:6; Philippians 2:5-6; 1 Timothy 2:5)

TRINITY

There is one God, eternally existent in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. These three are coequal and co-eternal. (1 John 5:7; Genesis 1:26; Matthew 3:16-17, 28:19; Luke 1:35; Isaiah 9:6; Hebrews 3:7-11)

JESUS' BLOOD

The Blood that Jesus Christ shed on the Cross of REVIVAL was sinless and is 100% sufficient to cleanse mankind of all sin. Jesus allowed Himself to be punished for both our sinfulness and our sins, enabling all those who believe to be free from the penalty of sin, which is death. (1 John 1:7; Revelation 1:5, 5:9; Colossians 1:20; Romans 3:10-12, 23, 5:9; John 1:29)

JESUS CHRIST LIVES IN ALL BELIEVERS

Christians are people who have invited the Lord Jesus Christ to come and live inside them by His Holy Spirit. They relinquish the authority of their lives over to Him thus making Jesus the Lord of their life as well as Savior. They put their trust in what Jesus accomplished for them when He died, was buried, and rose again from the dead. (John 1:12; John 14:17, 23; John 15:4; Romans 8:11; Revelation 3:20)

REDEMPTION

Man was created good and upright, but by voluntary transgression he fell; his only hope of redemption is in Jesus Christ, the Son of God. (Genesis 1:26-31, 3:1-7; Romans 5:12-21)

REGENERATION

For anyone to know God, regeneration by the Holy Spirit is absolutely essential. (John 6:44, 65; Matthew 19:28; Titus 3:5)

REPENTANCE

Repentance is the commitment to turn away from sin in every area of our lives and to follow Christ, which allows us to receive His redemption and to be regenerated by the Holy Spirit. Thus, through repentance we receive forgiveness of sins and appropriate salvation. (Acts 2:21, 3:19; 1 John 1:9)

RESURRECTION

Jesus Christ was physically resurrected from the dead in a glorified body three days after His death on the cross. In addition, both the saved and the lost will be resurrected; those that are saved to the resurrection of life and those that are lost to the resurrection of eternal damnation. (Luke 24:16, 36, 39; John 2:19-21, 20:26-28, 21:4; Acts 24:15; 1 Corinthians 15:42, 44; Philippians 1:21-23, 3:21)

SACRAMENTS

- **CHILD DEDICATION:** Child dedication is the act of giving back to God the gift he has given to you. It is an act of worship, thanksgiving, dependence, trust and commitment. The ceremony is an opportunity to make your commitment public before God, your friends and family. The ceremony also reminds parents to depend on God and His resources, including the church family and friends, to help nurture their children. **(Mark 10:13-16)**
- **COMMUNION:** A unique time of community strengthening in the presence of God when the elements of bread and grape juice (the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus Christ) are taken in remembrance of Jesus' sacrifice on the Cross. **(Matthew 26:26-29; 1 Corinthians 10:16, 11:23-25)**
- **MARRIAGE:** We believe marriage is defined in the Bible as a covenant, a sacred bond between one man and one woman, instituted by and publicly entered into before God. **(Matthew 19:4-6)**
- **WATER BAPTISM:** Following faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, the new convert is commanded by the Word of God to be baptized in water in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **(Matthew 28:19; Acts 2:38; Mark 16:16; Acts 8:12, 36-38; 10:47-48)**
- **FOOT WASHING:** Foot washing is a biblical act of humility and servant leadership, exemplified by Jesus washing his disciples' feet to symbolize spiritual cleansing and teach selfless service. **(John 13:14-15)**

SALVATION

We are saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ: His death, burial, and resurrection. Salvation is a gift from God, not a result of our good works or of any human efforts. **(Ephesians 2:8-9; Galatians 2:16, 3:8; Titus 3:5; Romans 10:9-10; Acts 16:31; Hebrews 9:22)**

SANCTIFICATION

Sanctification is the ongoing process of yielding to God's Word and His Spirit in order to complete the development of Christ's character in us. it is through the present ministry of the Holy Spirit and the Word of God that the Christian is enabled to live a Godly life. **(1 Thessalonians 4:3, 5:23; 2 Corinthians 3:18, 6:14-18, 2 Thessalonians 2:1-3, Romans 8:29, 12:1-2, Hebrews 2:11)**

SECOND COMING

Jesus Christ will physically and visibly return to earth for the second time to establish His Kingdom. This will occur at a date undisclosed by the Scriptures. (Matthew 24:30, 26:63-64; Acts 1:9-11; 1 Thessalonians 4:15-17; 2 Thessalonians 1:7-8; Revelation 1:7)

THE CHURCH

The Church is the Body of Christ, the habitation of God through the Spirit, with divine appointments for the fulfillment of Jesus' Great Commission. Every person who is born of the Spirit is an integral part of the Church as a member of the body of believers. There is a spiritual unity of all believers in our Lord Jesus Christ. (Ephesians 1:22, 2:19-22; Hebrews 12:23; John 17:11, 20-23)

THE GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Holy Spirit is manifested through a variety of spiritual gifts to build and sanctify the church, demonstrate the validity of the resurrection, and confirm the power of the Gospel. The Bible's lists of these gifts are not necessarily exhaustive, and the gifts may occur in various combinations. All believers are commanded to earnestly desire the manifestation of the gifts in their lives. These gifts always operate in harmony with the Scriptures and should never be used in violation of Biblical parameters. (Hebrews 2:4; Romans 1:11, 12:4-8; Ephesians 4:16; 1 Timothy 4:14; 2 Timothy 1:6-7; 1 Corinthians 12:1-31, 14:1-40; 1 Peter 4:10)

VIRGIN BIRTH

Jesus Christ was conceived by God the Father, through the Holy Spirit (the third person of the Trinity) in the Virgin Mary's womb; therefore, He is the Son of God. (Matthew 1:18, 25; Luke 1:35; Isaiah 7:14; Luke 1:27-35)
